DISTRICT COMMITTEE MEMBER CHAIR REPORT- JUNE 2018

At our District meeting on June 6, our California Northern Coastal Area (CNCA) Literature/Grapevine chair Miguel H. spoke passionately about why a Grapevine subscription can help members' boost their own sobriety and that of others. He focused on members not only reading and subscribing, but also adding their own unique voices to AA's meeting in print by putting pen to paper or calling in and recording their story. He also showed a cool video on the AA Grapevine's YouTube channel of a recorded share by a member that was made into an animated short.

The District Officers have taken up the task of reviewing District 90's Guidelines. We plan to make them more in line with practices that are already in place and make them more readable and clearer.

Coming out of that process was a discussion topic presented at the June meeting. It was inspired by the following current guideline:

The District decided, after extensive debate and discussion, to decline any funds, other than group contributions, for support of District operation. The discussion topic was "The Pros and Cons of Passing the 7th Tradition Basket at the District Meeting."
