that recovery is possible and that we are not alone in this journey.

\*\*Tradition 2: "For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern."\*\*

Tradition 2 reminds us of the importance of unity and collective decision-making within our groups. emphasizes that our ultimate authority is a loving God as expressed through our group This conscience. principle fosters a sense of equality and mutual respect among members, ensuring that no single person wields power over others.

In our group, Tradition 2 has been a guiding light, helping us navigate challenges and disagreements with a spirit of cooperation and humility. By recognizing that our leaders are trusted servants who facilitate rather than govern, we create an environment where every voice is heard, member and every valued. This tradition has strengthened our bonds and allowed us to work together harmoniously towards our

#### **STEP TWO**

"Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity."

#### Principle: Hope

The Second Step is to start believing that there is hope. By finding a power greater than ourselves — whether that is the power inherent in the collective community of Alcoholics Anonymous, or in a spiritual force of our own understanding - we come to believe in our ability to change. We see AA has worked for millions of people, and begin to believe it could work for us too. Believing there is hope is the essence of the second step.


