In honor of our 4th month, here is a summary of Step and Tradition 4;

**Step 4:** Made a Searching and Fearless Moral Inventory of Ourselves

Step 4 of Alcoholics Anonymous involves taking a deep, honest look at oneself. This step requires individuals to examine their thoughts, emotions. and behaviors that have contributed to their addiction and the impact these have had on their lives and relationships. The goal is to identify and acknowledge flaws, resentments, character fears, and harmful actions, which is essential for personal growth and recovery.

**Tradition 1**: Each Group Should be Autonomous Except in Matters Affecting Other Groups or AA as a Whole Tradition 4 emphasizes the autonomy of each AA group, allowing them to manage their own affairs independently. However, it also highlights the importance of considering the welfare of other groups and the AA fellowship as a whole when making decisions. This tradition ensures that while groups have the freedom to operate as they see fit, they must also be mindful of their impact on the broader AA community.

Looking forward to this change of the season and the new opportunities it will bring.




