Sometimes Things Just Take Some Time!

Back in 2010 Alcoholics Anonymous updated the AA Hope video using actors portraying AA members. This caused quite a stir in some areas of the AA community as many felt it violated our traditions of anonymity. As a member of my local Public Information (PI) Committee, I had seen firsthand the contrast from the original video, which used actual AA members filmed from behind or with their faces blurred and the updated video using actors. Our committee had been showing the original video for years in DUI classes as a part of our regular PI presentation and when we switched to the newer version, the results were immediate and profound. Our audience in the DUI classes were suddenly more interested and engaged. The identification process that happens in humans when they see faces, even actors' faces, is vastly more effective than other forms of communication.

The General Service Conference (GSC) adopted a policy regarding using actors in our videos and Public Service Announcements (PSAs) that made it virtually impossible to produce any video utilizing actors. In the following years, AA produced PSAs that used nature scenes, stick figures and animation. Not very effective, in my humble opinion. In 2017 the District 90 PI Committee proposed that AA make a PSA utilizing actors. The proposal went through the Agenda Topic process. It was first approved by the District, then sent to the Area PI Committee which approved and sent it to Area 06 for consideration.

The motion presentation at the Area included a showing of three PSAs produced by the General Service Office of Australia to illustrate how powerful our PSAs could be. The Aussie PSAs used actors that portrayed the "pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization" that accompanies chronic alcoholism. The Area overwhelmingly approved the motion, and it became an Agenda Item at the 69th GSC. The Conference approved the idea, opening the door to make it easier for AA to produce videos using actors. The result was two new PSAs: When Drinking Is No Longer a Party and My Drinking Built a Wall. Both are huge improvements over our previous attempts.

Fast forward to 2025: The 75th GSC has passed an Advisory Action: Three videos produced by the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous Australia ("Are You Risking Your Job?" "Are You A Danger To Your Family?" "Champain") be adapted by AAWS for use on media platforms in the U.S. and Canada.

I am over the moon excited, pleased and grateful for this development! The GSC has shown great courage and wisdom in adopting another General Service entity's tools for helping reach the next generation of suffering alcoholics.



What is Intergroup?


